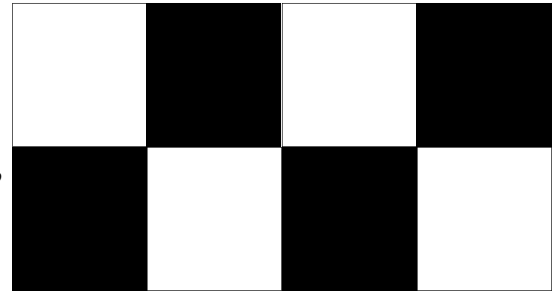

TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS:

Thank you for allowing your child to take driver education with us at Coach Miller's Driving School. We consider it a privilege to educate students in today's world of driving. We want your child to have fun while here, but at the same time, we take it very seriously.

Just a few suggestions to help things go smoothly while your child is in the process of completing the course and getting his/her driver license:

- When you get a chance, look at our "7 Days of Driving". It is posted by the checkered flags in the office. We go by this strictly. That way, we know that each student drives all aspects of city and highway driving. Also, if a different instructor has your child, that instructor knows where to drive.
- Allow your child to drive you places when you can do so. Allow some extra time, because it takes new drivers longer to get there than an experienced driver.
- When your child is driving, please stay calm. This is crucial. If you are calm, our young driver will stay calm.
- Do some night driving & bad weather driving, (rain only) when you feel that your child is ready to do so.
- Talk about rules of the road, other drivers you see doing things wrong, & ask what has been taught about certain situations.
- Most importantly, ease into it. It does not matter how much experience a child has, they are all "new drivers". Work into highways, downtown, etc slowly. Please do not take them to the Winter's Freeway or Interstate 20 the first time out.
- Keep a log of hours driven. This will help you evaluate progress and determine when your young driver is ready for the driver license.
- In the classroom, no cell phone activity is allowed. They are told the first day, that anyone texting, etc, will be sent home.
- In the car, cell phones are to be in the front seat with the instructor.
- The driving calendars are on a "first come, first serve" basis. To finish in a timely manner, get lessons reserved after obtaining the learner's permit from the DPS. It is recommended to skip a few days in between lessons.
- A second payment is due at the end of the classroom session, and the balance 30 days after classroom is over.
- Finally, when you are ready for your young driver to get the driver license, we have the necessary DE964 (another green sheet) to take to the DPS Office.
